

# **Giving Circle Worksheet**

**Instructions:** Follow along with the <u>video tutorials</u> and use this worksheet as a guide to strategize your giving circle.

#### 1. Jewish Values:

- a. What values inspire you to create your giving circle?
- b. How will you explore values with your participants and identify the shared values that bring you together?
- c. How will you include Jewish values, learning, reflection or community building in your giving circle?

#### 2. Mission, Vision, and Goals:

- a. Who/how will you decide on your giving circle's mission?
- b. What is the mission both the impact you hope to achieve and the goals for your giving circle as a community?
- c. If your giving circle is at an organization, what is the alignment with the organization's mission?

## 3. Giving Circle Meetings:

- a. How many times will your giving circle meet per cycle? How often? Where?
- b. If you have committees, when and how often will they meet?
- c. Who will plan the meetings? Who will facilitate?

## 4. Membership:

- a. Who will be in your giving circle?
- b. How many people do you hope to have?
  - i. What's the minimum number of participants with which you'd start your circle?
  - ii. Is there a maximum?
- c. Who will lead the giving circle?
- d. What is leadership responsible for?
- e. How will leadership transition?

#### 5. The money:

- a. How much will each participant contribute?
- b. Are there additional requirements (ie.: operating costs, donating to the annual campaign, volunteering)? How will these be included?
- c. Do participants need proof of donation for tax purposes?
- d. How will you collect participants' contributions?
- e. How will you distribute funds to grantees?

## 6. **Grantmaking process:**

- a. What is the possible range of grantees? How/will you contribute to Jewish causes?
- b. How many grants will you make? How big will they be?
- c. How will you identify possible grant recipients?
- d. How will you narrow down the possible grantees to a set of finalists? How will you choose grant recipients?
- e. Will there be any follow-up or communication with grantees?

## 7. Decision making process:

- a. Which decisions will participants make?
- b. How will each of these decisions get made?
  - i. If you will have committees, what committees do you need and what will they be responsible for?
- c. How will you inform participants of their roles and responsibilities, what's already decided and any rules around their decision making?

- a. What else will your giving circle do together (learn, volunteer, socialize)?
- b. How and when will that happen?
- c. How will you incorporate community building and fun into each meeting?
- d. How/will you engage with the broader Jewish community?
